"...my responsibilities as spiritual leader and interpreter of the faith are coupled with a deep commitment to improving the quality of life. These activities are not limited to the Ismaili community but extend to those who share their lives, whether on a local, national or international scale. Our duty is to try to free people from poverty. And to me, poverty means being without shelter, without protection, without access to healthcare, education, or credit, and without hope of ever controlling one's own destiny. This means condemning one's children and grandchildren to unacceptable living conditions.

A voluntarist and innovative strategy is needed in order to break this chain of despair and total imprisonment."

1. Countdown to Diamond Jubilee: Snapshots of Imamat – 1957 to 1962

Mawlana Hazar Imam became the forty-ninth hereditary Imam of the Shia Imami Ismaili Muslims on July 11, 1957 while still a student at Harvard University. He has led the community through political, economic, and social changes: from space exploration to end of colonial rule and the Cold War, the development of mass media communications, and advancements in medical technology.

Takhtnashini held in Dar es-Salaam (19 October 1957), Nairobi (22 October 1957), Kampala (25 October 1957), Karachi (22 January1958), Dacca (12 February 1958), and Bombay (now Mumbai) (1958).

"The huge new atomic power stations, the Sputniks and the vast throbbing machines of modern industrial life are symbols of a fresh chapter in material progress...I do not believe that we should fear material progress, nor should we condemn it. The danger is that it could become an obsession in our lives and that it could dominate our way of thinking. There is no reason why our traditions and our faith should stop us from moving with our times, nor in fact why we should not lead our fellowmen to new spheres of knowledge and learning....our traditions and our religion will always inspire the creations of our hands and minds."

Selected World Events – 1957 to 1962

- Prince Sadruddin was appointed <u>Special Envoy</u> to the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (1959). He served as Deputy High Commissioner for Refugess from 1962-1965.
- Prince Alykhan was appointed <u>Permanent Representative</u> of Pakistan to the United Nations from February 1958 to May 1960.
- The Soviet Union launched <u>Sputnik I</u> (1957) the world's first artificial satellite, ushering a new political, military, technological, and scientific developments era as well as the US-USSR space race. It also led directly to the creation of <u>National Aeronautics and Space Administration</u> (NASA).
- First <u>satellite to transmit voice signals</u> launched by US government's Project SCORE (Signal Communication by Orbiting Relay Equipment) from Cape Canaveral, Florida (1958).
- Russian cosmonaut Yuri Gagarin became the first human to journey into outer space, when his spacecraft orbited the earth (1961).
- The first working <u>laser</u> ("Light Amplification by Stimulated Emission of Radiation") was built (1960). In 1917, Einstein had laid the foundation for the laser when he introduced the concept of stimulated emission.
- Echo IA, the first <u>communications satellite</u> was successfully launched, ushering an era of communications satellites (1960).
- Unimation's industrial robot <u>Unimate</u>, considered the world's first industrial robot, worked on General Motors' automobile assembly line (1961).
- The <u>Berlin Wall</u> was erected (1961).
- In South Africa, Nelson Mandela sentenced to life imprisonment at Robben Island prison (1962).
- First videogame *Spacewar* was written (1962).
- General Electric produced the light-emitting diode (LED) (1962).

2. Countdown to Diamond Jubilee: Snapshots of Imamat - 1963 to 1967

During Hazar Imam's early Imamat, the countries that were emerging from colonial rule began to revise their economic and education aspirations, developing new services to meet their needs. Consequently, many of the education and health institutions established by Imam Sultan Mahomed Shah needed to be strengthened and expanded, and new institutions were established.

"There are those who enter the world in such poverty that they are deprived of both the means and the motivation to improve their lot. Unless they can be touched with the spark which ignites the spirit of individual enterprise and determination, they will only sink into apathy, degradation and despair. 

Silver Jubilee Emblem

At the centre of the emblem is Hazar Imam's crest surrounded by 25 crescents representing 25 years of leadership. The outer ring embodies verse 3:103 of the Quran in Thuluth calligraphy script:


And hold firmly to the rope of Allah all together and do not become divided. And remember the favour of Allah upon you – when you were enemies and He brought your hearts together and you became, by His favour, brothers. And you were on the edge of a pit of the Fire, and He saved you from it. Thus does Allah make clear to you His verses that you may be guided.



The Thuluth script derives its name from the Arabic *tuluth*, meaning 'one-third,' because one-third of each letter slopes. Another theory to the meaning is that the smallest width of the letter is one-third of the widest part.



The seal of Aga Khan University is a visual representation of the principles inherent in the founding of the University. The circular form of the seal with its different levels of imagery contained in concentric circles has its visual roots in the rosettes of early Islamic periods. The circle also symbolises the world and reflects the internationality of the University.

At the centre of the seal is the sun. Light is a universal

symbol for the enlightenment that education provides. The light emanating from the star is also symbolic of Nur (Divine Light). The star incorporates 49 points to commemorate the University's founding by Mawlana Hazar Imam, the 49th Imam of the Ismaili Muslims. The outer ring contains an excerpt from the Qur'anic Ayat (3:103) rendered in classic Thuluth script:

And hold fast, All together, by the rope Which God (stretches out for you), And be not divided among yourselves, And remember with gratitude



Imam's crest is surrounded by 50 crescents representing half a century of Mawlana Hazar Imam's leadership. The outer ring embodies verse 4:1 rendered in Fatimid Kufic calligraphy script:



O mankind ! Be careful of your duty to your Lord Who created you from a single soul and from it created its mate and from them twain hath spread abroad a multiple of men and women.

White was the official colour of the Fatimids (909-1171). During their reign, when the city of Mecca was part of their empire, they adorned the Kaba in a white *kiswa* with verses of the Quran embroidered in gold thread (Hunsberger, *The Ruby of Badakshan*, p 156).
